Clare Holland House expansion complete

Patients, family members, carers and staff will benefit from the newly completed expansion of Clare Holland House, providing improved spaces for patient and staff to work and gather.

The \$6 million expansion funded by the Commonwealth Government and The Snow Foundation, and delivered by the ACT Government, provides an additional eight palliative care inpatient beds enabling palliative care for an additional 250 patients a year.

Senator for the ACT Zed Seselja said the expansion will boost palliative care services for the region as our community continues to grow and demand for palliative care increases.

“While many people prefer to receive their palliative care services in their home, it is vital the ACT has services available for people to receive acute health care and support during the final stages of their life.

“More Australians will require palliative care as our population grows and ages, I acknowledge the Snow Foundation for their generous and community-focussed decision to join the Australian Government in funding this expansion project,” Senator Seselja said.

ACT Minister for Health Rachel Stephen-Smith said the expansion not only increases the capacity of Clare Holland House, but it also provides spaces for patients and their loved ones to spend time together.

“Clare Holland House provides care in some of the hardest times of a person’s life and when a family may be saying goodbye to their loved one.

“This expansion includes improved spaces for family members to spend with their loved ones, including a new family lounge, private courtyards and spaces for family to stay overnight.

“Improved clinical spaces and nurse stations will support staff to continue delivering exceptional care to patients,” said Minister Stephen-Smith.

The Snow Foundation Founder and Chair Terry Snow AM said the foundation’s \$2 million donation towards the expansion is one of the largest single donations made in its 30 years’ existence.
